


Mental Distress and the Broadway Musical Aleksei Grinenko

During the Broadway musical's golden age in the mid-20th century, creative teams used the currently in-vogue psychoanalytic ideas to construct troubled characters at odds with themselves and their worlds. *Seriously Mad* offers a dynamic account of stage musicals' engagement with significant theories about mental distress, illness, disability, and human variance. The book explores changing definitions of madness in U.S. history, and how, in attempts to bring musicals closer to highbrow sophistication, theater dramatized serious medical conditions and social problems. Among the productions discussed are *Next to Normal, A Strange Loop, Sweeney Todd, Man of La Mancha, Gypsy, Oklahoma!*, and *Lady in the Dark.*



The early drama of Eugene O'Neill opened up extraordinary opportunities for Black performers to challenge racist structures in modern theater and cinema. *Racing the Great White Way* recovers not only vital lost performance histories, but also the layered contexts for performing bodies across the Black Atlantic and the Circum-Atlantic. Challenging the widely accepted idea that Broadway was the white-hot creative engine of U.S. theater during the early 20th century, Katie N. Johnson reveals a far more complex system of exchanges between the Broadway establishment and a vibrant Black theater scene in New York and beyond to chart a new history of American and transnational theater.


This volume documents the creation of *Chocolate Woman Dreams the Milky Way*, a play written and performed by Monique Mojica with collaborators from diverse disciplines. Inspired by the pictographic writing and mola textiles of the Guna, an indigenous people of Panama and Colombia, the book explores Mojica's unique approach to the performance process. Her method activates an Indigenous theatrical process that privileges the body in contrast to Western theater's privileging of the written text, and rethinks the role of land, body, and movement, as well as dramatic storystructure and performance style.

In this book, Ewell unpacks the mythologies of whiteness and western-ness with respect to music theory, and gives, for the first time, his perspective on the controversy surrounding the publication of Volume 12 of the *Journal of Schenkerian Studies*. 

Drawing on a mix of collaborative autoethnography, secondary literature, interviews with leading improvisers, and personal anecdotal material, *Jamming the Classroom* discusses the pedagogy of musical improvisation as a vehicle for teaching, learning, and enacting social justice. Suggesting a closer consideration of why musical improvisation has been largely expunged from dominant models of pedagogical inquiry in both classrooms and communities, this book asks what it means to theorize the pedagogy of improvised music in relation to public programs of action, debate, and critical practice.
